- You have had close contact with persons known or suspected to have active TB disease
- You have been a resident, volunteer, and/or employee of high-risk congregate settings (e.g., correctional facilities, long-term care facilities, and homeless shelters)

Peru

**Philippines** 

- You have been a volunteer or health-care worker who served clients who are at increased risk for active TB disease
- You have been a member of groups that may have an increased incidence of latent M. tuberculosis infection
  or active TB disease (medically underserved, low-income, or abusing drugs or alcohol)

... then you must meet Cornell's TB screening requirement (see next page).

#### **Cornell's TB screening requirement:**

Following American College Health Association and public health guidelines, Cornell requires full-time students who meet any of the criteria listed on page 1 to provide documentation of results from a recent TB screening.

- **TESTS:** Only a **Quantiferon-TB Gold** or **T-SPOT blood test** will be accepted. Skin tests do *not* meet this requirement. If your TB blood test result is positive, you also must submit a chest x-ray report (no films).
- **DATES:** Summer or fall 2023 entrants: your test must be dated September 1, 2022 or later. Spring 2024 entrants: your test must be dated February 1, 2023 or later.
- **DOCUMENTATION:** Enter information using the "TB Screening" form in your Medical Clearances list in myCornellHealth. Visit health.cornell.edu/requirements for details.

**If you are not able to obtain required TB screening or documentation before coming to Cornell**, you must arrange for TB screening as soon as you arrive on campus. See health.cornell.edu/requirements for more information.
